

DOA NEWS FOR JANUARY, 2016

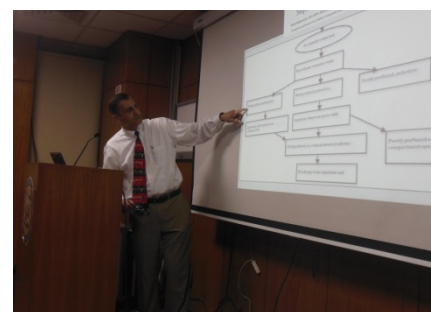
Dear friends, continuing with the academic activities of last year, orthopaedic fraternity of Delhi saw a number of events being organised in the first month of 2016, setting the pace for the year to come.

WDOA held a meeting on Shoulder trauma and Pain management guidelines at Radisson Blu Hotel at Paschim Vihar, New Delhi on 7th January, 2016. Among



the prominent faculty was Dr Ramakant Aggarwal, Dr Manoj Vats, Dr Atul Vaish, Dr Harmesh Kapoor. Topics covered included trauma around shoulder especially proximal humerus and latest recommendations on usage of NSAIDS in orthopaedics practice. There was also discussion on various case scenarios and recommendations on managing trauma cases. The meeting was attended by around 40 delegates.

A Pediatric Orthopedics CME was held at Chacha Nehru Bal Chikitsalaya, Geeta Colony, Delhi on 12 January, 2016 by Dr. Anil Aggarwal. The programme was organized under aegis of Pediatric Orthopedic Foundation (POF). It was first in the series of CME to be conducted by POF, intended to introduce pediatric orthopedics as a distinct orthopedic speciality to the budding orthopedic surgeons. The CME was accredited by the Delhi Medical Council for 2 hours 15 minutes. Dr. Sanjeev Sabharwal, an internationally renowned faculty in pediatric orthopedics from Rutgers-New Jersey Medical School, USA was the invited faculty. The



CME topics were Lower limb deformities in children: Lessons learned, Publishing in peer reviewed journals: Few tips, Pink pulseless hand following supracondylar fractures. The CME also included some case presentations which generated healthy discussion among the peer group. The meeting was attended by over 75 enthusiastic participants.

Continuing with the teaching program for post graduates, AIIMS organised the DOA teaching course on 16th of January, 2016. The topic for the teaching course was 'Sports injuries of the knee joint'. Post-graduate students from various institutes in Delhi attended and actively participated in the course. Following the brief introductory lecture about sports injuries by Dr. Bhavuk Garg, 4 clinical cases were discussed in the course that lasted two and a half hours.

Professor Rajesh Malhotra, Professor Ravi Mittal and Dr. Vijay Kumar presided over the discussion sessions. The case discussions were conducted in a manner which would be akin to the final examination faced by post-graduate students. However, it was filled with active comments and queries from the participants. There was one long case (chronic anterior cruciate ligament tear), two short cases (multi-ligamentous injury and chronic anterior cruciate injury without instability) and one spot diagnosis (discoid meniscus). All the cases were discussed thoroughly and the faculty ensured that every query of the participants was addressed and all the relevant findings and examination methods were demonstrated. During the demonstration of classical signs voluntary participation from all the students attending the course was sought. Cases were presented by Dr. Nitish Kumar, Dr. Naman Wahal, Dr. K. Manoj and Dr. Nishank Mehta (all of them are post graduate students).

The case discussion was followed by a brief enlightening talk by Prof Ravi Mittal regarding the decision making in such cases. All the students appreciated the practical and applied knowledge gained through the course.

Sports Injury centre and Safdarjang Hospital, organised a Cadaveric workshop on basic knee and shoulder arthroscopy on 30th and 31st January. Prominent faculty included Dr. Deepak Chaudhary,



Dr Himanshu Kataria, Dr. Ravi Gupta, Dr Amite Pankaj and Dr. Prateek Gupta. It was attended by around 20 delegates from India and abroad.

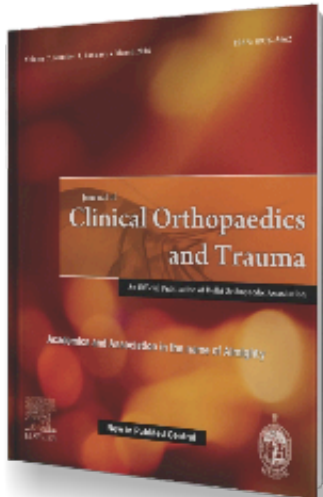
